Cattle News from Producers:

Slaughter cow and bull prices have followed their seasonal trend and continue to sell at lower price. Average to high-yielding slaughter cows have ranged from \$52 to \$64 per cwt the last few weeks. The smoother, more desirable kind of short-solid and broke mouth bred cows are still selling at a premium to packer prices. The best demand would be for those at least 5 to 7 months bred, to calve this winter and early spring on grain fields. If you are not sure what needs pregnancy testing, we will gladly take a look and do what is in your best interest. Remember, our veterinarian is here early on Thursday mornings so please have any cows needing to be tested at Producers by late Wednesday night.

Roller coasters at Six Flags don't have any more twists, turns and dives than we have seen in this year's stocker and feeder calf prices. Mid to late fall can always be a tough time to market calves, especially those with no vaccination history and freshly weaned. Heavy bull calves and the plainer offerings, including longhorn crosses, have been hit the hardest with steep discounts. Thankfully, we have seen slightly improved demand for the better quality steers and heifers, especially those with two full rounds of vaccinations prior to weaning. We hope to see the market make its usual recovery as we move toward and into a new year.

Sheep and Goat News:

As predicted, the Muslim holidays helped the sheep and goat markets maintain strength through the first part of fall. The goat market stayed at high levels until the week before July 4th. The first week after the 4th, the goat market fell off \$30 to \$40 per cwt. By mid-September, the wooled feeder lamb prices started to fall off due to increased movement in Northern states which helped to fill up major feedlots in about 4 weeks.

The good side of all this, for our area, seems to be everyone has relatively good range conditions going into winter. November 1st the market took a step in a positive direction, partially due to a lighter run and most likely the anticipation of fewer numbers coming in the near weeks.

Deer season begins November 5th and many people hesitate to work stock so as to not disturb their hunters. This Texas phenomena usually helps to limit numbers at the sale during the late fall. Producers will be closed for the week of Thanksgiving, so the livestock handlers have to adjust for that as well, to be able to take care of their customers.

Remember, we will also shut down for the Christmas holidays, from December 23rd through January 2nd. Our first sale of 2017 will be January 3rd.

The sheep and goats are not showing stomach worm issues as often as they were this time last year and that's a good thing. The hair sheep numbers seem to still be on the rise and the varmints don't care what kind of kid goats or lambs they eat. Stay after those critters so you can send us big numbers of sheep and goats in 2017.
